The annual cost of weed harvesting is approximately \$14,000.00. The weed harvester itself is also in need of a paint job which may cost as much as \$7,000.00. We need your help!

#### equivalent of composted cow manure. We estimate about 500 lbs. of phosphorous is removed annually by reducing the weed mass in the Bay. This year, we hope to increase our productivity.

Weed removal improves water quality by improving water circulation and wave action. The incidence of algae blooms is greatly reduced and there is evidence keeping weed growth in check causes weeds to be reduced over time.

Each season, the SAAWA harvester removes around 400 tons of wet weeds from St. Albans Bay. About 10% of those weeds is solid organic matter which when composted has the nutrient
